The bobbin lace bat was in the Fall 2008 IOLI Bulletin - The designer, Lynn Stiglich, will be at our lace day to explain how to work it, for those who need some help. Prickings will be provided at Lace Day for those who do not have the bulletin.

The bat is done in two parts. Threads used were Kreinik metallic tapestry (medium) braid #12 in burnt orange for the gimp and black Bockens 60/2 linen for the rest.

For the inner part use 6 pairs: Gimp – 2 yards on each bobbin, 1 worker pair – 4.5 yards on each bobbin, 2 inner pairs – 2 yards on each bobbin, 2 outer pairs – 3 yards on each bobbin.

For the outer part of the bat use 6 pairs: Gimp – 2.5 yards on each bobbin, 1 worker pair – 6 yards on each bobbin, 2 inner pairs – 3 yards on each bobbin, 2 outer pairs – 4 yards on each bobbin.

OIDFA IN JAPAN

Three USA OIDFA Council members attended the July Administrative Council meeting in Japan and had many interesting experiences. Since Japan's economic boom in the 1980's, the Japanese have ventured around the globe and we had seen them many times as a group of tourists. At this meeting we met individual Japanese lacemakers and learnt to know their hospitality and helpfulness. Most of them had language difficulties with the English vocabulary, but persevered. We were together in a relaxed atmosphere and there was also work to do. The Japanese excel in doing small things beautifully and they have an interpersonal attentiveness and sensibility. I learned all about this in the Tamari class I was in following the Council meeting. We ate crisp slices of lotus and were unsure about many of the other Japanese foods in their traditional lacquered lunch boxes. The Japanese do not use napkins of any kind at mealtime, and only when there is a five course dinner are there cloth napkins. We discovered diners don't tip in Japan.

The 14th World Lace Congress will be held in Kobe, Japan July 9-11, 2010. Classes are planned before the Congress, there are five to choose from, and a four day cultural tour will follow the Congress program.
